Please display the property address in a location and manner which is readable from the street. Numbers should be no less than 4" on both sides of your mailbox and on your house.

The Town of Pelham adopted a street numbering ordinance at the 1988 Town Meeting. In 2000 the international building code, with updates, was adopted by the Town. The purpose of these ordinances is to ensure the safety of members of the community, property and the members of EMS performing emergency services.

In 2007 the Pelham Board of Selectmen officially adopted the standards set forth by the NH Bureau of Emergency Communications-E911. This prompted the renaming and renumbering of several streets in Town. Since 2016, we have been busy catching up with the addressing of many of the second dwelling units in houses around Town.
