# Possibility of making a community garden in Merriam Farm after timber harvest ( Al Steward) We welcome Al to talk about the garden project and to answer questions of the forestry committee.

Al Steward, Jenny Larson and Danielle Masse Quinn, came to present the possibility of a community garden on town forest land.

The proposed location of the garden in their presentation did not line up with the wildlife habitat that forestry, with the guidance of Eric Raddlof, Forestry's forester, is trying to conserve and create.

Eric Raddlof suggests, communicated through Chris Gallaher, proposed locating the garden to the western portion near Gumpus Brook. That would be near the new parking lot entrance off of Mammoth Rd.

Forestry supports this garden idea and we would love to see it succeed. Bob, Paul, Deb and other forestry members said they would help with finding maybe a better location for the garden. Deb suggested scouting out a spot at PVMP. This way the garden would be protected from out of town and possibly local vandalism due to the keycard gate for access to the area.

### Mowing service options for the fields at Gumpus, Cutter, Merriam, Merriam Farm, PVMP and Wolven. (Deb)

Deb stated, due to best practices used in developing wildlife habitats, the fields need to be mowed and maintained so that the wild grasses, wildflowers, berries, etc, can best benefit our local wildlife. Deb suggests having all town forest fields be evaluated and put on a mowing schedule.

Paul made a motion to vote- Paul will reach out to Eric Radloff to request an estimate of the cost to include, evaluating all of Pelham's town forest's fields, making a mowing schedule for each field and the first round of mowing.

Charlie second Paul's motion to obtain this estimate.
