TOT CAMP 2024 Q&A for Parents

We sometimes have a camper and even a Tot Counselor with peanut allergies. I know it is difficult but please try to send peanut-free snacks and lunches on camp days to ensure the children's as well as staff's safety. See the Camp Director, Pattie Parece, with any questions on this or other Tot Camp issues. Masks will not be required.

Do we have a microwave at camp?

We do not. Please send cold lunch items and drinks in an insulated lunch bag or box.

Do we send bathing suits every day?

Yes, please pack a bathing suit and towel each day. Weather permitting, we will enjoy water play. Please sunscreen campers each day. You may also pack bug spray for field activities and or nature walks.

How much water should we pack?

Please try to send along extra water for the children. They do get thirsty and are encouraged to drink a lot of liquids throughout the day. I have picked up some extra cases of water to leave in the refrigerator in the event the children run out. Several parents have also donated water; freeze pops and Popsicles (Thank You!). Any other donations are welcome.

How do we line up for carpool?

Please line up straight ahead facing the dumpster. When you arrive, please wait for the camp staff to begin the carpool process each morning. We will begin the carpool by 9:50 am and bring the children into the building. Afternoon pick-up will be the same. We will bring the children down the hill and call the carpool numbers as the cars arrive at 2 pm. This process ensures the safety of all the children and siblings in the parking lot.

Is there a phone at the Camp?

Yes, there is a landline. We are outdoors for a good portion of the day but rotate in and out of the building. If we are not in the building, please try again. The cell phone is not typically feasible at this location.

Tot Camp Groups

Although we spend most of the day together, we have 2 or more groups of children. The groups are given names, such as Guppies and Turtles. Camp Supervisor, Pattie Parece, will be working with all groups each day and supervising staff. All staff are CPR and 1st Aid certified. Teen volunteers help as well.

The groups have individual morning meetings and group activities for smaller group instruction. Otherwise, the children have a free choice of activities such as crafts, indoor & outdoor activities as well as water activities. Snack & lunch all staff and children eat together and have the choice of eating indoors or outside in the field or at the picnic tables. Staff members supervise each station.
