Community Spirit. Mr. Scanzani explained that he has applied for a grant through them but has

not heard back and does not know if any funds will be awarded in time to cover the costs for the remainder of the year. He also stated that he has contacted two of the gaming sites, but they were all full for the remainder of the 2023 year, and he has been put on the wait list for 2024.

Chairman Cote explained that unless a selectman wants to make a motion to continue paying, there will be no more payments since they only agreed to pay the bill until January. Mr. Scanzani explained that there had not been payments made since August 2022. He added that the bill is \$37.00 per month but since no payments were made when they were supposed to be, they added on fees. The current charge is \$98.28 for past due payments, once this is paid, they will be up to date.

Chairman Cote asked Town Administrator Roark if any bills were submitted to the town for the internet costs. Town Administrator Roark stated that the billing goes through Mr. Scanzani, who is then supposed to submit the bills to the Town to get reimbursed. Chairman Cote asked if Mr. Scanzani has submitted any bills to the Town for reimbursement. Mr. Scanzani explained that he had submitted bills before they closed the account, and now the past due amounts must be paid before the internet can be reinstated. Chairman Cote asked Mr. Scanzani what the past due amount is. Mr. Scanzani stated that it is \$98.28. Mr. Bergeron noted that Mr. Scanzani should have been paying the bill and then submitting it to the Town for reimbursement, if he had done this there would not have been any back payments due. Mr. Scanzani explained that he thought he was supposed to bring the bill to the Selectmen's offices to get it paid after he received it in the mail.

Mr. Croteau suggested the Town pays the current past due bill for \$98.28, then Mr. Scanzani can try and get donations to help pay the bill going forward. Chairman Cote noted that the \$98.28 in past due charges are not up to December, so they should pay the charges through December and then it will be up to Mr. Scanzani to find funds to pay the bill going forward. Town Administrator Roark explained that the Town was paying the internet bill through September, but starting in October the Town did not receive the bills that Mr. Scanzani submitted. Chairman Cote noted that the Town then only owes Mr. Scanzani three months of the internet bill for October, November, and December. Chairman Cote asked Mr. Scanzani if the account is in his name. Mr. Scanzani confirmed that it is. Chairman Cote noted that Mr. Scanzani should be able to access his account information to get more information about the past due balances and fees. Chairman Cote also asked Mr. Scanzani what exactly he is looking to get paid. Mr. Scanzani explained that the last receipt he has was the bill for August that was paid in September, but nothing was paid afterward. Town Administrator Roark explained that he will prioritize the Town paying the bills for the missed payments up until December of 2022, and then allow Mr. Scanzani to get the internet turned back on.

Mr. Scanzani also let the Board know that the flagpole at the Historical Society building is going to be painted within the next few weeks, and he has a new American flag coming in as well. Mr. Scanzani will also have the State flag on the side of the building within the next few weeks. He is still waiting for the Town of Pelham flag because it has to be specially ordered. The new slate roof has been completed as of this week as well. Mr. Scanzani also mentioned that the Budget Committee had suggested to him in the past to get the property boundaries surveyed and a septic

system installed. He let the Board know that he was going to get a quote for this project as soon 93 as he can. Mr. Scanzani explained that he would also like if some of the doors in the building can 94 be scraped and repainted. 95 96 97 Ms. Takesian asked about the Historical Society parking situation, and if the Town could put more parking spaces in the back of the building. Mr. Scanzani explained that, according to the 98 Town's tax maps, the building sits on .3 of one acre, so there is not a lot of extra room in the 99 back. He added that there are about six parking spaces on the side of the building, and some 100 people also park in the parking lot at St. Patrick's Church. Town Administrator Roark added that 101 there was around \$21,000.00 that was supposed to be used for the slate roof repair for the 102 Historical Society building, and this has allowed them to complete a lot more projects to help 103 improve the building. 104 105 106 Vote to accept updated Welfare Policy 107 Town Administrator Roark explained that the basic structure of the updated policy is based on 108 the New Hampshire Welfare Administrator's Association recommendations and best practices. 109 This policy will give the Town objectivity and a guideline so that they can assure general 110 assistance is distributed fairly. 111 112 (Croteau/Bergeron) To approve the Town's updated Welfare Policy. 113 **MOTION:** 114 **VOTE:** (5-0-0) The motion carried. 115 116 117 Capital Improvement Plan Committee request for additional BOS Representative 118 119 120 Chairman Cote noted that Ms. Takesian has offered to take on the Capital Improvement Committee.
