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years or more as set forth in RSA 229:5, VII. Mr. Steward explained that although all Class VI roads are deemed subject to gates and bars, the select board must still regulate such structures to assure public access as stated in RSA 231:21-a, I. However, the public, including motor vehicles, cannot be barred from using a Class VI road, except as weight limits, seasonal or otherwise, prohibited as stated in RSA 231:191. He noted that even if this is put into place, Class A trails can be used by owners of land abutting the trail, land served exclusively by such a trail for non-developmental use or access to existing trails.

Mr. Steward stated that as soon as a Class VI road is created there is no longer a burden on the Town to maintain it in any way, except it allows the municipality to undertake such "work deemed necessary to render such way passable by firefighting equipment and rescue or other emergency vehicles roads". Mr. Steward thinks that this would be a good responsibility for the Conservation Commission because they have funding to use and can work with the Board of Selectmen and Town to make sure no one is at a disadvantage.

Mr. Croteau asked if the Town has been in the wrong all this time for locking the Class VI road gates, according to the RSAs that Mr. Steward presented. Town Administrator Roark explained that you cannot lock a Class VI road, and if private property owners are locking the Class VI road gates or the Town officially does it - this goes against the RSAs. Chairman Cote asked if you are allowed to put a lock on a Class A trail gate. Mr. Steward said you cannot. He added that you can come up with trail restrictions and turn it into a Class B walking trail.

Chairman Cote explained that although he agrees with everything Mr. Steward said regarding how they should handle the Class VI roads and Class A trails, he does not believe this is a job for the Conservation Commission as it does not align exactly with what their responsibilities are. He sees this as more of a Town wide responsibility. Mr. Steward explained that the Board of Selectmen is the responsible entity and has the right to delegate this and maintain access. Mr. Bergeron stated that it might be a good idea to have the Conservation Commission conduct research to see what issues are present and bring that information back to the Board of Selectmen, but he does not think the Conservation Commission should have the full responsibility either. Mr. Steward stated that the Conservation Commission does try to help with open space issues, and he considers this open space. Mr. Cote asked what Mr. Steward's plan was if the rest of the Conservation Commission was not interested in dealing with this. Mr. Steward explained that it was fine with him if they were not interested, but he still wanted to bring the issue before the Board of Selectmen, so they were aware they were going against the RSAs.

Mr. Croteau asked Mr. Steward if he was suggesting donating St. Margaret's road to Fish and Game. Mr. Steward explained that the Town should discontinue it and convince Fish and Game to consider a conservation easement on their property. Chairman Cote noted that this would require a Town vote, and the Board would need to draft a warrant article. Chairman Cote suggest Mr. Steward brainstorm with the Conservation Commission and work with other departments in Town on the steps the Town should take going forward. Town Administrator Roark explained that one of the Conservation Commission's duties is to manage conservation and recreation land, and he thinks these trails fall under recreation. Chairman Cote noted that a lot of this land is private property still, so they need to be careful about managing it. Town Administrator Roark suggested tasking Mr. Steward in providing the Board of Selectmen with a detailed list of the roads and trails, and they can decide at a future meeting how to handle the needed changes.
