Shall the Town vote to raise and appropriate as an operating budget, not in-cluding appropriations by special warrant articles and other appropria-tions voted separately, the amounts set forth on the budget posted with the war-rant or as amended by vote of the first session, for the purposes set forth herein totaling Twenty-One Million, Seven-Hundred Ninety-One Thousand, Eight-Hundred and Seven-Three Dollars (\$21,791,873)?
